

AAIA Offers Scholarship on Land-Resource Conservation

The Association on American Indian Affairs has available a \$1,000 scholarship for an American Indian student pursuing any aspect of land-resource conservation, protection, and development at any university.

Preference will be given to first-year graduate students, although consideration will also be given to graduate seniors and second and third year graduate students.

Land-resource conservation, protection, and development would include such fields as forestry, hydrology, marine biology, mining, soil conservation, agri-

culture, environmental sciences, etc.
