

GED by TV

Alaskans 18 years of age or older can begin evening classes on February 13 that will last until early June. Meetings twice a week will help people learn the basics in reading, math, science and social studies so they can pass the GED or high school equivalency exam.

Classes begin with a half-hour TV program, followed by individual help for those who need it. Some homework is required using three study guides

which cost \$10.00 for the set.

These same programs will be shown on KUAC-TV for people who cannot attend classes. Individual help will be available for those who prefer to watch programs at home.

The instruction is free. The only other expense will be a \$5.00 fee for taking the GED exam.

This GED by TV series is presently being used by more than 300 learning centers in 40 states. The program has proved very effective--91 percent of the GED students who take the high school equivalency test pass it.
