On March 31, 1975, Doyon, Limited filed selection application F-19155-1, as amended, under the provisions of Sec. 12(c) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971 (43 U.S.C. 1601, 1611(c) (1976)) (ANCSA), for the surface and subsurface estates of certain lands withdrawn pursuant to Sec. 11(a)(1) for the Native village of Huella.

The application excluded two unnamed lakes as being navigable. As these are considered nonnavigable and as Sec. 12(c)(3) and 43 CFR 2552.3(c) require the region to select all available lands within the township, the beds of these lakes are considered selected.

As to the lands described below, the application, as amended, is properly filed and meets the requirements of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, as amended, and of the regulations issued pursuant thereto. These lands do not include any lawful entry perfected under or being maintained in compliance with laws leading to acquisition of title.

#### TO THE ABOVE NAMED INDIVIDUALS:

A settlement has been reached in Case No. F81-004 Civil, *Gravenstein v. Local 879* which is a class action lawsuit concerning picket fees assessed by Local 879 during the period of time between June 1979 and October 1980. These picket fees assessed by Local 879 are refundable to you. The amount of the refund to which you are eligible ranges between \$5.00 and \$80.00 depending on how much you paid in picket fees. As part of the settlement payment of interest on any refunds has been waived.

Under the terms of the settlement you are entitled to obtain a refund of the picket fees paid by you to Local 879. Alternatively, you are entitled to have the picket fees paid by you applied toward your present or future dues rather than having the fees refunded to you. You may also waive any refund to which you are entitled. IF YOU WISH TO RECEIVE A REFUND OF PICKET FEES, OR TO WAIVE REFUND OF THE FEES, OR HAVE THE FEES APPLIED TO YOUR DUES, YOU MUST NOTIFY LOCAL 879 OR PLAINTIFFS' ATTORNEY IN WRITING OF YOUR CURRENT MAILING ADDRESS. This notification of your rights under the Settlement will be published twice during two consecutive weeks. The final date of publication will be June 29, 1983. UNLESS YOUR WRITTEN NOTIFICATION TO LOCAL 879 OR TO PLAINTIFFS' ATTORNEY IS POSTMARKED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE LAST DATE OF PUBLICATION, YOU WILL FORFEIT FOREVER ANY REFUND OF THE PICKET FEES TO WHICH YOU ARE ENTITLED. Upon receipt by Local 879 of your written notification of address, you will be notified in writing of the amount of picket fees to which you are entitled and the alternatives available from which you may choose.

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
