He pointed out that this will only be a short run solution to the growing demand for gas in Barrow.

"The new well will provide a second access to a gas field which has been in use for almost 10 years. The supply in this field will one day be exhausted." "I have urged," he said, "that the Navy have additional funds to undertake a major study of the total potential of Pet 4 and to locate additional gas fields. Last week I asked that the bud-get for the Navy's Petroleum get for the Navy's Petroleum activities be increased four times so that such exploratory work can be conducted. "It is important," Senator

Gravel continued, "that the full potential of Pet No. 4 be known, because I look forward to the day when the Navy will either lease Pet 4 into the private sector or dispose of it altogether. This will be of immense importance to all of Alaska.
