Morton Expresses Concern Over Death of Yellow Thunder

Secretary of the Interior
Rogers C. B. Morton expressed
"concern" over recent events in
Gordon, Nebraska, following the
death of Mr. Raymond Yellow
Thunder, an Oglala Sioux of the
Pine Ridge Reservation in South
Dakota.

The Secretary noted that five persons were arrested and charged under a State law by local officials in Gordon, Neb., with various counts of false imprisonment and manslaughter following the death of Mr. Yellow Thunder.

"Both Commissioner Bruce of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and I are watching developments carefully concerning this matter," Morton said. "I have asked the Justice Department to look into the matter and take appropriate action.

"In addition," Morton said,
"I have directed the Field Representative and Regional Solicitor
of the Department of the Interior, who have been on the scene,
to investigate the matter fully
and report their findings as soon
as possible to Commissioner
Bruce and me."
