Stockholders Recommend Times Raise Subscription Rates to \$10

The stockholders of the cskimo, Indian. Aleut Publishing Co., the company that publishes the Tundra Times, have recommended that the firm increases the subscription rate to the newspaper from \$8.00 per year to \$10.00 or more per year.

The recommendation to the Board of Directors was made at last Friday's annual stockholders meeting at the Villa restaurant in Fairbanks.

The main reason for the request was last year's increase in postal rates and the impending additional increase in postal rates that will be effective in May.

The newspaper is mailed to most localities throughout the state, to Lower 48, and to many foreign countries.

The board will discuss the subscription rate increase recommendation at its March's monthly meeting and it is expected that it will be approved to at least \$10.00 per year.

The stockholders also said that after the board's approval on March 5 meeting, the current subscribers or new subscribers will have 60 days grace in which
