AMU to Offer Tlingit Course

A course in Tlingit conversation and grammar will be offered at Alaska Methodist University

beginning Feb. 9.

Instructing the course will be Mrs. Nora Florendo, a native speaker of Tlingit who has considerable experience teaching the language at the community college and high school levels in Southeastern Alaska.

Mrs. Florendo has worked also as a translator and as a consultant to educational and cultural research projects involv-

ing the Tlingit language.

Tlingit is the most widely spoken Alaskan Indian language. Persons interested in the cultures of the Pacific Northwest have long been fascinated by the language.

The course, entitled English 352 Ethnic Languages and Literatures of Alaska, will meet from 6:30 to 9 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays in Grant Hall on the AMU campus.
