Work will include surveying, cutting brush and trees using chainsaws, and will often involve air and boat transportation. All applicants must be in excellent physical condition and health.

SURVEY TRAINEES will assist the other crew members and office personnel as needed. They will be trained in field survey procedures and techniques. It is hoped that many will eventually become Instrument Persons and Party Chiefs for future Maniilaq survey projects. They will frequently operate chain saws and other equipment. No survey experience is required, but applicants should be a high school graduate (or GED), in good health, with an interest in working outdoors. Pay will be \$12 per hour.

SURVEY PARTY CHIEFS will supervise the crews and be responsible for day-to-day survey work. Considerable field land survey experience, preferably surveying Native Allotments, is required. Alaska Registered Land Surveyors are preferred. Pay will be \$24 per hour.

INSTRUMENT PERSONS will operate the electronic survey instruments, assist the Party Chiefs, and help cut line as needed. Considerable field land survey experience, preferably surveying Native Allotments, is required. Much experience operating instruments is needed and experience using electronic data collectors is a plus. Pay will be \$18 per hour.

THE QUALITY CONTROL ASSISTANT (QCA) will assist the Project Manager in ensuring compliance with BLM survey requirements. The QCA will inspect other crews' work, review office computations, and perform independent field checks. Registration as an Alaska Professional Land Surveyor is required. Pay will be \$26 per hour.

The SURVEY COMPUTER OPERATOR (SCO) will perform all survey computations including coordinate geometry, geodetic calculations, and prepare all of the plots and sketches using CAD. Applicant must be an expert in the use of AutoCad, other computer software, and electronic data collection. Applicant should have field survey experience, preferably as Party Chief. Pay will be \$24 per hour.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN REGULATIONS AND A PUBLIC MEETING

COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under the authority of AS 16.43.100, 110(a), 150 and 170 proposes to adopt, amend, renumber or repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the transfer of permits, to implement 1992 legislative amendments made to AS 16.43.150 and 170 (ch 55, SLA 1992).

The Commission proposes changes throughout Article 17 of its regulations (20 AAC 05.1700 -- 1700) to establish procedures for the involuntary transfer of a limited entry permit due to an execution by certain authorized creditors of a permit holder. Additionally, the proposal renumbers and rewrites some of the existing regulations in order to clarify and to remove ambiguous or obsolete language.

Interested persons may submit written comments to the Commission, for the attention of Ms. Sandy Samaniego, at the address indicated below. To be considered,

comments should be received no later than Monday, April 26, 1993.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.
