 REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
 MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS**

NOTICE is given that the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, under authority of AS 26.10.010 proposes to adopt regulations in Title 10 of the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC), dealing with the reimbursement of veterans' service organizations for the employment of service officers, AS 26.10.040 — AS 26.10.050, as follows:

The proposed regulations add a new Chapter 10 to Title 10 of the AAC relating to the reimbursement of veterans' service organization for the employment of service officers. The proposed regulations provide for reimbursement to be accomplished through grants. The proposed regulations provide for a competitive process in which interested organizations will submit written proposals and make oral presentations to a grant awards advisory board. The board will evaluate the written proposals and the oral presentations and will make recommendations to the Director, Division of Veterans Affairs, as to the amount of money to be granted. The final decision will be made by the Director. An appeal procedure is provided by the proposed regulations. The proposed regulations limit reimbursement to organizations chartered by the Congress of the United States. The proposed regulations require organizations to account for expenditure of money received for reimbursement.

NOTICE OF UTILITY CONTRACT FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that ALASCOM, Inc. (Alascom), a long lines telecommunications utility, has filed a contract which has been designated as TA270-88. The proposed contract is between Alascom and AT&T to provide FTSS2000 service. The filing with the Commission is limited to the intrastate aspects of FTSS2000. Alascom requests that both the contract and the cost support submitted with the filing be accorded proprietary status and that the Commission approve the filing on April 13, 1990.

Alascom states that FTSS2000 is a combination of telecommunications services being acquired by the General Services Agency of the federal government. Alascom states that the services it has agreed to provide include intrastate message telephone service, intrastate private line service and interstate private line service. Alascom states that revenues under FTSS2000 will exceed those it currently earns under the FTSS contract. The terms of the initial contract is three years subject to renewal.

If after the Commission finds a rate of classification different from that proposed by Alascom is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that filed.

Any interested person may file a statement of views favoring or opposing this tariff filing with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. While comments will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, they will not serve to make the person a party to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to intervene in accordance with 3 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.
