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STATE OF ALASKA NOTICE OF VILLAGE MEETING OF TAZLINA RESIDENTS CONCERNING MUNICIPAL TRUST LAND

Notice is hereby given by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, pursuant to AS 44.47.150 and 19 AAC 90.210-290, that a village meeting of Tazlina residents will be convened on December 12, 1996, at 7:00 pm in the Tazlina community hall for the following purposes:

1. General discussion of Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) and the Municipal Lands Trustee Program; and
2. Discuss and obtain the views of the residents of Tazlina concerning a proposal to accept an ANCSA 14(c)(3) land conveyance from Ahtna, Inc. and subsequently dispose of the same land to the Copper River Basin Regional Housing Authority for HUD housing lots.
3. A village meeting resolution concerning the proposal will be voted on by the residents of Tazlina.

The meeting will be open to the public. Bonafide residents of the unincorporated village of Tazlina in attendance may vote on any village meeting resolution affecting the above matter. A bonafide resident is a person over the age of 18 years (or who is the head of a household if less than 18 years) who resides in Tazlina within the meaning of AS 15.05.020; i.e., one who would otherwise be eligible to vote in a city election if Tazlina were an incorporated first or second class city.

In the event the meeting cannot be convened by the undersigned or his designee at the time stated, the meeting time will be postponed on an hour to hour basis that same day, and if necessary, the following day between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. or as may be otherwise stated in a publicly posted notice in response to telephoned instructions from the undersigned.

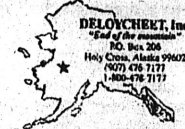

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has recently published proposed regulations regarding the administration of special use permits on national wildlife refuges in Alaska. The regulations clarify and update existing special use permit regulations. The most significant changes concern the administration of competitively issued permits, including but not limited to sport hunting and fishing guides.

The public meetings are being conducted to provide information and to receive public comment. The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION gives notice that WORLD TELECOM GROUP, INC. (WTG), a long distance telephone company, has filed a tariff revision (TA2-453) to make miscellaneous change to its rates.

WTG proposes to add the following rates:

Rate per minute when establishing an automatic renewal	\$2.490
account of \$100.00 or more	

WTG proposes to designate the currently effective intrastate rates as WTG Grandfathered AmeriVox Prepaid Calling Card Service Rates. The currently effective rates are divided into two categories: Rate Step 1 and 2 rates as shown below.

PRESENT	PROPOSED
Rate Step 1 rates apply exclusively to non-Alaskan subscribers who subscribed to the Company's service prior to 1 November 1993 and who may make intrastate calls in Alaska.	Rate Step 1 rates apply exclusively to subscribers who subscribed to the Company's service prior to November 1993 and who may make intrastate calls.
All subscribers subscribing to Company's service on or after 1 November 1993 are subject to Rate Step 2 rates.	Rate Step 2 rates apply exclusively to subscribers who subscribed to the Company's service after 1 November 1993 and before August 12, 1996.

WTG also proposes to revise the Call Detail Records rate provisions to

- ◆ Delete the provision stating, "Specific call charges are available from the Company's Customer Service department at no charge."
- ◆ Add a provision stating that call detail "records may be requested in ASCII format or, Comma Delimited, dBASE IV, FoxPro, and Microsoft Excel Software."
- ◆ Replace the current rates for Call Detail Records with the following proposed rates:

WTG also proposes to delete the speed dial and subscriber requested dialing restriction rates from the Additional Features section.

WTG also proposes to delete activation fees.

If the Commission finds that the proposals by WTG are not just and reasonable, the Commission may approve rates or classifications which vary from those proposed.
