# **Public Health Program**

No less than 12 Indians and Alaskan Natives are expected to participate in scholarship programs in Public Health at the University of California, Berk-

eley, next fall according to Elaine Walbroek, deputy director of a Special Master of Public Health Project.

"We anticipate recruiting an equal number for the following year. Any circulatization of this information that you can give would be very welcome," she writes.

Full tuition to the University of California is offered with traineeship stipends for living expenses available at \$3,600 base and \$500 for each dependent.

Students must be a Native American and have a Bachelor's degree from college. Graduates will find employment openings in many agencies: health facilities, hospitals, health services, planning groups, health delivery systems and in many other areas.
