SECOND NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN REGULATIONS AND OF A PUBLIC MEETING

COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under the authority of AS 16.43.100, 110(a), 150 and 170, proposes to adopt, amend, renumber or repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the transfer of all permits and implementing 1992 legislative amendments made

to AS 16.43.150 and 170 (ch 55, SLA 1992).

The Commission proposes changes throughout Article 17 of its regulations (20 AAC 05.1700 — 1770) to establish procedures for the involuntary transfer of a limited entry permit due to an execution by certain authorized creditors of a permit holder. Additionally, the proposal rennumbers and rewrites some existing regulations in order to clarify and to remove ambiguous or obsolete language to make procedures consistent for all permits.

Interested persons may submit written comments to the Commission, at the attention of Ms. Susan Haymes, at the address indicated below. To be considered, comments should be received no later than Monday, September 20, 1993.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

SUMMARY NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED SETTLEMENT BETWEEN PLAINTIFFS AND DEFENDANT ALYESKA PIPELINE SERVICE COMPANY

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, there are currently pending in the Superior Court of the State of Alaska, Third Judicial Division, and the United States District Court for the District of Alaska class action lawsuits against Alyeska Pipeline Service Company ("Alyeska") and against the owners of the Trans Alaska Pipeline System ("Owners").

1. A settlement agreement (the "Settlement Agreement") has been reached on behalf of the following class (the "Settlement Class"):

All persons and entities, excluding Direct Action Plaintiffs, who (i) have filed, submitted or otherwise made or asserted Claims, or (ii) are within the scope of any class prayed for in any complaints filed at any time in the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Litigation or based upon the Oil Spill, including, but not limited to, the following subclasses of the Settlement Class, as specifically described and defined in Exhibit B to the Settlement Agreement and in Attachment I, hereto: A) Commercial Fishermen; B) Alaskan Natives; C) Area Businesses; D) Property Owners; and E) Cannery Workers, and including all classes previously certified by the Superior Court, provided that, for these purposes, the class prayed for in C. N. Butcher et al. v. Exxon Corp. et al., Case No. 3AN-89-2672 Civil in the Superior Court and Case No. A-89-140 Civ. in the District Court, is defined in paragraphs 4 and 14 only of the complaint in said case and paragraph 11 of the complaint shall be inapplicable.

If you are a member of this class, your rights may be affected by this litigation. The Settlement Agreement is on public file with the Courts.

2. The Settlement Agreement is for a sum of Ninety-Eight Million Dollars (\$98,000,000.00), of which approximately Forty-Eight Million Dollars (\$48,000,000.00) will be distributed to members of the Settlement Class. The balance will be distributed to persons who have filed direct actions against Alyeska and the Owners, and to plaintiffs' counsel for fees and expenses.

3. The settlement will become effective if approved by the Courts after a joint hearing before the Federal District Court Judge and State Superior Court Judge to be held at 9:00 a.m. on October 28, 1993 in the United States District Court for the District of Alaska, Courtroom 2, Federal Building, 222 West 7th Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska 99513, for the purpose of (i) determining whether the settlement agreement is fair, adequate and reasonable, and therefore should be approved; (ii) approving the Plan of Allocation; and (3) approving the amount of attorneys' fees and litigation costs that should be awarded to plaintiffs' counsel. You are entitled to appear and be heard at the hearing subject to certain conditions described in the Notice to class members. The time and date of the hearing may be continued from time to time without further notice.

4. This is only a summary notice. 5. Members of the class described above shall be bound by any judgment with respect to the class as part of the settlement, if approved by the Courts, unless they exclude themselves from the class. However, in order to receive your share of the settlement, you must complete and return a Claim Form to the above address by September 28, 1993. The Claim Form can be obtained by contacting Plaintiffs' Co-Lead Counsel. If you wish to object to the settlement or to exclude yourself from this settlement, you must follow the procedures set forth in the detailed notice. If you wish to be excluded, you must file a written request to be postmarked on or before October 15, 1993. If you exclude yourself from the class, you will not be eligible to participate in the benefits of the Settlement Agreement, should it be approved.

ATTACHMENT 1 SUBCLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Alaska Native Class. The "Alaska Native Class" consists of all Alaska Natives, tribal entities, Native governments, Native entities performing quasi-governmental functions, and their agencies, who engage in, rely upon, promote, preserve, or provide services for, wholly or in part, a subsistence way of life in the following areas: Native Village of Chenega Bay, Eyak Native Village, Port Graham Village, the Native Village of English Bay, the Native Village of Tatitlek, the Native Village of Kodiak, the Native Village of Larsen Bay, the Native Village of Karluk, the Native Village of Port Lions, the Native Village of Ahkiok, the Native Village of Ozukine, Ivavot Bay Village, the Native Village of Chignik Bay, the Native Village of Chignik Lagoon, Chignik Lake Village, Seward, Valdez, and the Native Village of Perryville, the Kenai Peninsula Borough, the Kodiak Island Borough, the Lake and Peninsula Borough, and the Aleutians East Borough.

Commercial Fishing Class. The "Commercial Fishing Class" consists of all persons and entities engaged in the commercial cultivation, fishing and/or harvesting of fish, other seafood, or marine resources in the State of Alaska and waters adjacent to it. This class, and subclasses of it which may be designated for various species, harvest areas and/or types of permits and/or activities, includes, inter alia, longline bottom fishermen, kelp pounders, herring seiners, herring pilcheters, wild roe on kelp harvesters, salmon seiners, salmon gill netters, seiners, crabbers, tendermen and other holders of commercial fishing permits and/or licenses, their crews and their employees.

Area Business Class. The "Area Business Class" consists of all persons and entities in any business providing goods, equipment or services in the area surrounding Prince William Sound and within Kodiak Island Borough, Kenai Peninsula Borough, Aleutians East Borough and Lake and Peninsula Borough.

Property Owner Class. The "Property Owner Class" consists of all persons and entities who are owners of real property in the area surrounding Prince William Sound and within Kodiak Island Borough, Kenai Peninsula Borough, Aleutians East Borough and Lake and Peninsula Borough.

Cannery Workers and Seafood Processing Employees Class. The class consists of cannery and seafood processor and/or maintenance employees who had a reasonable expectation of employment after March 23, 1989, in the areas affected by the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill.
