- (2) has been a resident of the North Slope Borough for 30 days immediately preceding the date of the election;
- (3) is registered to vote in State of Alaska elections;
- (4) is not disqualified under Article V of the Constitution of the State of Alaska.

5. The type of election, general or special: The election is a special election.

6. The proposition submitted to the elector is:  
Shall the North Slope Borough, Alaska, issue its general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed the sum of FIVE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,464,000) for the purpose of financing the cost, in whole or in part, of the construction, improvement, betterment, repair, reconstruction or acquisition of Public Housing in North Slope Borough, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment, furnishings and facilities, and the acquisition of lands or rights in lands in connection therewith, in accordance with and ratifying and approving the provisions of Ordinance Number 75-1 of the North Slope Borough Assembly adopted on February 11, 1975.
