

UBA promotes Sells

United Bank Alaska has appointed Barbara Sells as vice president and controller, according to Eugene B. Erskine, president and chief executive officer.

Sells formerly was an Assistant Vice President with National Bank of Alaska, where she began her banking career in 1970.
