Dear Annie,

I UNDERSTAND THAT THE STATE OF TEXAS HAD THEIR CAPITAL BUILT FOR NOTHING BY PRIVATE ENTERPRISE. IS THIS CORRECT?

Yes. The capital was financed and built by private enterprise and given to the state in exchange for raw land. The New Capital Site Planning Commission refused to entertain proposals on the same basis in the Willow site. There are 65,000 acres of state-owned land within the site. I believe our next legislature will entertain proposals of this nature when they plan for the move.
