

Two Contracts for Kodiak Let

JUNEAU — Governor William A. Egan today announced the awarding of contracts for two Kodiak projects totaling over \$1 million.

A \$677,140 Public Works department contract for a Kodiak regional state office

building was awarded to Burgess Construction Co., Fairbanks. The two-story curtain-wall and steel-frame building is scheduled for completion in November 1974.

And a \$415,415 contract for reconstruction of a section of

highway between Kodiak and the Kodiak Coast Guard Base, which was heavily damaged by a rock slide from Pillar Mountain last December, was awarded to Brechan Enterprises Inc. and Northern Exploration and Equipment Co., both of Kodiak.
