1. The Northwest Arctic Borough desires to acquire the services of a Certified Public Accounting firm having significant governmental accounting and auditing experience at the Municipal and Tribal level to audit and to express an opinion on the financial statements of said municipalities and tribal government for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1986 and 1987; September 30, 1986 and 1987 for Tribal Governments.

2. The scope of the audit shall include all funds and account groups of each entity listed. The examination shall be conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and principles by the National Council of Government Accounting, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

3. The Auditor shall express an opinion as to:

- A. The combined financial statements of each municipality/tribal government.
- B. The municipalities compliance with OMB issued circular A-128, and
- C. The municipalities compliance with the Federal Revenue Sharing Act and regulations.
- D. State's single audit requirement compliance.

4. The auditors shall issue a Management letter dealing with internal controls, accounting procedures, and other significant observations, together with appropriate recommendations thereon for each municipality and tribal government. Copies of final working papers will be made to the Northwest Arctic Borough and each entity audited.

6. The proposal will be evaluated by the Borough staff on the basis of the proposer's audit plan and the estimated cost of the audit agreement. The final award will be subject to the approval of the Assembly of the Northwest Arctic Borough.

7. The Northwest Arctic Borough reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive informality and minor irregularities in the proposals received. It is contemplated that an agreement will be awarded to that responsible offeror whose proposal will be most advantageous to the Borough and Municipalities. The right is reserved to accept other than the lowest proposal.
