

Tribal Council to be held by UTA

A workshop and classes on helping tribal councils to become more efficient will be held by the United Tribes of Alaska and University of Alaska in April.

The works village Council Training Workshop will be titled "Effective Tribal Councils, yesterday...Today...Tomorrow...TOGETHER," and seeks to train council members and administrative personnel of IRAs and traditional village councils in organizing and operating their village councils.

Tentative workshop topics include sessions on IRA Incorporation petitions, developing tribal constitutions and by-laws, developing tribal ordinances and resolutions, funding sources and technical assistance resources, and classes on IRA profit corporations.

Other special topics include a lecture on UTA - What is it, comparison of IRA councils and second class cities, emerging IRA issues, and micro-computers for village councils.

Registration fee is \$150 and

must be pre-paid before April 6. The workshop will be held from 8:30 to 4:30 p.m. daily from April 16 through April 19 in the Federal Building in Anchorage.
