U. S. Weather Bureau is predicting 13-15 feet flooding about the third week of May. This would be, at worse, four feet under the record flood of 1967.

The weather outlook for Fairbanks is ideal for gradual snow run-off with temperatures averaging four to five degrees below normal, according to the latest forcast.

Light precipitation is expected, however it will not sufficiently add to moisture in the Chena River Basin.

For these still betting on high water the Fairbanks Disaster Office, P. O. Box 790, has just printed a set of instructions to aid in pre-flood planning.
