EDUC. NEEDS

JUNEAU—Proposals for programs designed to provide for the supplemental educational needs of Alaska Native children were reviewed and assigned funding priorities in meetings ending June 19 in the Juneau Area Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The proposals were considered by the members of the Johnson-O'Malley Review Committee comprised of representatives from the 12 Native regions of Alaska. Eleven of the 12 regions were represented during the meetings.

At the direction of BIA Area Director Clarence Antioquia, JOM Review Committee members considered 72 proposals and assigned priorities for allocating nearly \$5 million earmarked for supplemental education needs of Native children during fiscal year 1976.

The Review Committee is assigned to advise the Bureau Area Director on funding priorities and objectives of the Johnson-O'Malley Program.
