

Children's adventure: Making Native masks

Yup'ik Eskimo contemporary mask artist Jack Abraham will conduct a Children's Art Adventure at the Anchorage Museum of History and Art March 24 from 10 a.m. to noon.

Timed to coordinate with the 1990 Alaska Native Heritage Festival which will be taking place at the museum, children ages 8 to 12 will observe a variety of Alaska Native artists working on all types of art forms and then will be instructed by Abraham in making their own lifelike masks of clay.

Originally from Nelson Island, Abraham now makes his home in Anchorage where he has received many honors and commissions for his masks.

Participation in the workshop costs \$5, payable in advance from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the Administration Office on the second floor of the museum.
