A total of 222 Alaskan artists submitted 695 works, and 116 were selected for the exhibition. The \$1,000 Juror's Choice Award was given to Dan Miller of Anchorage for "A June Day in the Chugach Mountains." The exhibition will remain on view at the Anchorage Museum of History and Art through March 25. It is organized every two years by the museum and funded by the Municipality of Anchorage and the Anchorage Museum Association through a grant form the Alaska State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts.
