NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATION OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 18.43.010 and following, proposes to adopt and amend regulations in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement the provisions of AS 18.43.100 and 290 as follows:

- 1. to provide for an application period for entry permits to be issued for the Northern Southeast Inside sablefish longline, the Southern Southeast Inside sablefish longline, and the Southern Southeast Inside sablefish pot fisheries; 2. to amend 20 AAC 05.090(a)(1), relating to the "Joint Ownership of Vessel" paragraph of the Southeastern crab pot system, to clarify the commission's intent; and 3. to amend 20 AAC 05.090(a)(2), relating to the skipper status threshold of the Southeast crab pot system, to make this paragraph consistent with other provisions of the pot system.

Interested persons may submit written comments to the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission. To be considered, comments should be received no later than May 29, 1987.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that BARROW UTILITIES AND ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC., a gas utility, has filed a tariff revision (TA4-35) which is a request to revise its tariff because of numerous changes to the rules and regulations section of the tariff. The new tariff rules and regulations are divided into the following sections: Definitions, General Provisions, Application for Service, Landlord Service Agreement, Service Connection and Disconnection, Deposits, Billing and Delinquent Accounts, Right-of-way, Right-of-access, Point of Delivery, Inspections, Consumer's Responsibilities, Outage Calls, Meter Readings, Meter Installations, Meter Testing and Adjustments, Temporary Service, Line Extension Policy, Discontinuance of Service by Cooperative, Delinquent Payments Available, Procedure for Customer Complaints, Discounts, Charges for Various Utility Services. BUECI proposes changes throughout the rules and regulations. One example of a proposed change concerns the line extension policy. Presently, BUECI's tariff provides that the utility will not charge an applicant for a line extension up to and including 800 feet. For applicant whose line extension exceeds the basic offering, the utility calculates the cost of the line beyond the 800 foot allowance and amortizes this amount over a period of not more than three years. This cost is added to the monthly bill of the consumer, but the consumer is entitled to use the amount of his guarantee in gas consumption. In the new rules and regulations BUECI proposes a standard offering of trenching, installation of 60 feet of one inch P.E. pipe, backfill from the trenching, service riser, bracket and "up" to a 250 size gas meter; beyond this standard offering, extensions may be accomplished by a special contract. If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by BUECI is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.
