Pursuant to 19 AAC 90.140(c) and .910, notice is hereby given that the undersigned has found the "Petition for Recognition" submitted by the Mentasta Village Council to be acceptable under applicable sections of the Municipal Trust Land Regulations. No adverse written comments were received nor were other petitions filed pursuant to a Notice dated June 20, 1983 which was published on June 29, 1983 and July 7, 1983 and posted in the village on June 25, 1983. The undersigned hereby states his intent to recognize the Mentasta Village Council as the appropriate village entity, under AS 44.47.150 and 19 AAC 90.010 et seq., to represent the residents of Mentasta Lake in decisions affecting municipal trust land administered by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, State of Alaska. This recognition will take effect, without further notice, thirty (30) days following the date this notice is posted or thirty (30) days following the last date of publication, whichever is later, unless adverse written comments are received within that period, and will remain in effect thereafter unless and until rescinded in accordance with 19 AAC 90.150.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this decision, an agency of the Federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the modified decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with the attached regulations in Title 43 CFR, Part 4, Subpart E as revised. However, pursuant to Public Law 98-487, this modified decision constitutes the final administrative determination of the Bureau of Land Management concerning navigability of water bodies.

If an appeal is taken the notice of appeal must be filed in the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of Conveyance Management (960), 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513. Do not send the appeal directly to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. The appeal and copies of pertinent case files will be sent to the Board from this office. A copy of the appeal must be served upon the Regional Solicitor, 701 C Street, Box 34, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

The time limits for filing an appeal are:

- Parties receiving service of this modified decision by personal service or certified mail, return receipt requested, shall have thirty days from receipt of this modified decision to file an appeal.
- Unknown parties, parties unable to be located after reasonable efforts have been expended to locate, parties who failed or refused to sign their return receipt, and parties who received a copy of this modified decision by regular mail which is not certified, return receipt requested, shall have until September 28, 1983 to file an appeal.

Any party known or unknown who is adversely affected by this modified decision shall be deemed to have waived those rights which were adversely affected unless an appeal is timely filed with the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of Conveyance Management.
