### STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Program Reviewers of Child Nutrition Programs (such as National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Special Milk Program, Child Care Food Program) are being solicited to conduct administrative reviews, provide technical assistance, and conduct workshops statewide. This solicitation is in anticipation of funds approval.

#### Minimum Qualifications are:

1. Bachelor's Degree in Food Service Management, Nutrition, Home Economics or related field. Substitution: 5 years of increasingly responsible experience in Food Service Management to include direct supervision of food service operations in a school, hospital, or institution, menu planning and evaluation, planning and conducting inservice training programs, budgeting, and purchasing.
2. Attendance of Training Program conducted by Department of Education on September 28-30 or prior experience as a Child Nutrition Program Reviewer in the State of Alaska.
3. Must be available to travel at the convenience of the Department of Education.

Contract covering approximately 10-30 days per year will be awarded. Alaska Business License will be required.

To apply: Submit a State of Alaska Employment Application (available at most State of Alaska agencies) to School Food Services, Department of Education, Pouch F, Juneau, Alaska 99811. Applications must be received by September 19, 1983.
