> Chapter 53, 7 AAC 53,010 -- AAC 53,370 is a new chapter replacing "Foster Home Care Payments," 7 AAC 50,710 - 7 ACC 50.850. Article 1, "Child Foster Care Payments," contains the payments rates to foster parents for specific levels of F care. A new Article 2 is created to specify the conditions for Subsidized Adopting Payments, Article 3, "Children in Custody: Needs and Income," contains the payment provisions for specific costs, such as medical costs regardless of the child's placement setting. One section, 7 AAC 53.360, deals with the unearned income of a child in State custody.

> Article 3, 7 AAC 50.310 -- 7 AAC 50.620 dealing with licensing of child foster homes is amended. The proposed child foster home regulations contain the basic standards of care that foster parrents must meet in order to be licensed to care for toster children. Some of the proposed changes include: more direct involvement by the foster parents in a foster child's plan of care; annual foster parent training; new time limit restrictions on emergency and provisional licenses; and a section entitled "Reports" which lists the reports and time frame in which a foster parent must submit the report to a placement agency.

A new Article 2, 7 AAC 38.205 -- 7 AAC 36.240 and 7 AAC 36.900 dealing with grievance procedures primarily for clients, client's parents or guardian, or a provider of services of the Division of Family and Youth Services, is created so that the above mentioned persons may attempt to settle a grievance quickly and within the Division. The new regulations will establish an informal procedure for settling grievances. A Division supervisor will initially review the grievance and if a settlement cannot be reached, a regional panel will review the grievance case, hear additional information if necessary, and submit a report to the Division Director. #### NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Notice is given that the State Board of Education, under authority vested by AS 14.07.060, proposes to repeal, adopt and amend regulations in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with governing the use of corporal punishment as a disciplinary measure in schools, to implement and interpret AS 14.07.020(a)(1), (6) and (7) and AS 14.45.100, as follows:

4 AAC 07.010 which establishes school district guidelines and procedures for student rights and responsibilities, and discusses behavioral standards and student discipline, is amended by adding subsection (c) which prohibits the use of corporal punishment in Alaska's public schools as a disciplinary measure. 4 AAC 07.900 establishes in regulation a definition of the term "corporal punishment." Previously there was not a definition for this term in regulation nor a prohibition on its use.

4 AAC 42, which deals with approval and supervision of private and denominational schools is proposed for amendment by adding section .200 which would establish criteria for the use and reporting of corporal punishment in private and denominational schools. Existing regulations do not contain such criteria. The proposed regulations would require that each private school develop a written policy for the use of corporal punishment as a disciplinary measure, including who may administer the punishment, the type of punishment to be used and circumstances under which corporal punishment may be used, and a requirement for the school to obtain parental permission prior to use of corporal pusishment. An exemption is provided for home schools in which only children in a single family are enrolled and taught by their parent or guardian. Other schools are required to

have the policy mandated in this section on file in the Department of Education,, and may administer corporal punishment only in accordance with that policy. Specific reporting requirements are defined for each school which has developed a policy which permits the use of corporal punishment as a disciplinary measure. Exempt private schools will be required to comply with this regulation because it relates to the physical health of private school students.
