Villages along the Kushokwim River and nearby Yukon villages plan an exploratory organizational meeting to be held in Aniak, January 26th and 27th to see if there is sufficient interest to create a permanent organization bascel at Aniak

Max Coles University of Alaska extension agent said he had been asked to help with the proposed meeting. He indicated the purpose of the group would be to look out after the general interests of the entire area.

He said invitations were being sent to villages along the Kushokwim River from Lower Kalskag to McGrath and to Holy Cross, Anvik, Grayling, and Shageluk on the Yukon.
