

# STATE TAXES

The per capita state tax rate for Alaska in 1966 was \$194.11, up from the \$173.99 in 1965. Average per capita tax revenue for all states increased \$15.33 from 1965 to 1966, rising from \$135.24 to \$150.60. The per capita rate in Alaska was sixth highest in the nation. Those states showing higher per capita tax revenues than Alaska for 1966 were, in relative order: Hawaii, Delaware, Washington, Wisconsin, and New Mexico.

Alaska state tax revenues totaled \$52,799,000 for fiscal 1966, up 19.9% from 1965. Tax revenues for the prior year had been \$44,019,000. Of the total, individual income taxes amounted to \$19,238,000, an increase of 16.2% over 1965.

Average increase in total state tax revenues for all states was 12.4% from 1965 to 1966, although seven states had higher increases than Alaska. Idaho and Kansas had an increase of 31.5% and

30.8% respectively.
