Some of the things you can do to avoid seasonal accidents:

- 1- Be sure, by inspection, that your heating plant is clean and free from the soot deposits that can cause a burn-out and cost you your home.
- 2- Have more than one exit from your home cleared and ready for use—just in case.
- 3- If you decorate home or tree, or both, be sure to use only those electrical decorations that are clearly marked with the Underwriter's Laboratory (UL) label.
- 4- Use all electrical decorations and appliances as directed, and only as directed.
- 5- Observe the one common sense driving rule at all times, whether you drive a dog team or a motorized vehicle. **IF YOU DRIVE DON'T DRINK** and if you drink beyond your capacity to maintain all your senses **DON'T DRIVE!**
