

Foundation will do Native series

The Alaska Native Foundation has announced submission of a proposal designed to address problems of discrimination against Alaska Native students residing in urban areas of the state.

The project, which proposes to produce six one-half hour video tapes, will be aimed at students in the 4th, 5th and 6th grades, in the urban cen-

ters of Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau, Bethel, and Kodiak.

As part of the application procedures, ANF has selected an advisory committee composed of residents of each of the urban areas to be served. Committee members are: Chuck O'Connell, Anchorage; Tiny Devlin, Anchorage; Len Sevdy, Juneau; Bertha Cavanaugh, Juneau; Theda Pittman, Anchorage, Bill Per-
