EDUCATION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education, under authority vested by AS 14.43.105, proposes to amend and adopt regulations in Title 20 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the Scholarship Loan Program, to implement AS 14.43.105, as follows:

20 AAC 15.900(b)(3)(C) is repealed and redrafted to define the term "full-time" student for those enrolled in a non-flight school career education program as a student enrolled for at least 30 clock hours per week, a clock hour being a period of time which is equivalent of: (i) a 50 to 60 minute class, lecture, or recitation; or (ii) two hours of outside preparation related to the activities in (i) of this subparagraph, for up to a maximum of ten such preparation hours per week.

20 AAC 15.900(b)(3) is also amended by adding a new paragraph (D) to define the term "full-time" student for those enrolled in an approved flight school program as a student who logs a minimum of 40 hours per month, including pre- and post-flight instruction and ground school hours, or averaged 80 hours for a two-month period.

20 AAC 30, which deals with the regulations of the Alaska State Council on the Arts, is proposed to be amended by:

(1) redesignating Article 10, 20 AAC 30.640-710, which was reserved for regulations dealing with the Percent for Art program.

(2) adopting new provisions in Article 10 to provide for Initiative Grants for New Works. The proposed regulations establish the scope of the grant program, applicant eligibility criteria, application process requirements and application evaluation criteria.

This notice is a correction of the public notice dated July 18, 1984 pertaining to the Teacher Scholarship Loan Program.

20 AAC 15 is amended by adding Article 2 dealing with the Teacher Scholarship Loan Program.
