

Doyon stockholders elect new officers

More than 200 shareholders of Doyon, Limited attended the corporation's 1977 annual meeting at the Traveler's Inn on March 19th. Doyon President, Tim Wallis opened the meeting reporting a \$1,300,000 profit for the 1976 year, which because of a change in procedure represented a 10-month period.

Ken Chase of Anvik, Roger Huntington of Galen and Jules Wright of Fairbanks were elected new members of the Doyon Board of Directors. Sam Demientieff, Mike Harper and Al Ketzler were re-elected for another two-year term.

Four resolutions to change the Corporation's Bylaws were ratified as well. They were the

appointment of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Company as the new audit firm, the changing of the corporate fiscal year to begin November 1 and end October 31 each year, allowing more than four directors to serve as officers of Doyon and setting the number of seats on the Board of Directors at eleven members.

The Doyon shareholders meeting was one highlight of an event-filled week in Interior Alaska. The same evening, the Fairbanks Native Association hosted its annual potlatch in Fairbanks. The North American Championship Dogsled Races, won by Doyon shareholder Carl Huntington, were also held over the weekend.
