Gordon Jackson files for Anchorage seat

Gordon Jackson, former executive with the Alaska Federation of Natives, Inc. and the state's Rural Development office, filed Tuesday for the State House, in District 11 of South Anchorage.

Neither of the incumbents, Lisa Rudd and Kris Lethin, has

filed for re-election.

Jackson ran once before, in 1976, and came within about

500 votes of winning.

"I'm going to run a real agressive, issue-oriented campaign," Jackson said. "South Anchorage is the fastest growing district in the area and with fast growth comes needs like proves goods better educations."

Jackson is currently employ-
