## The Arctic



When at Cold Bay, visit the old-est Aleut community in the world

## **Bering Sea Coast**

The waters of Bristol Bay are an angler's delight. And, the Deltas of the Kuskokwim and the Yukon Rivers contain vast birdnesting areas that lure the birders and naturalists. It is here that the most traditional Eskimo villages are found, with Bethel at their hub. To the north across Norton Sound lies Nome. Unique for its turn of the century gold rush glory which is still preserved today in the atmosthe town. It is here too, that the trail ends for the mushers of the Iditarod Trail International Sled Dog Race.
