Pursuant to Presidential Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands, the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities provides notice of intent to place approximately 3900 cubic yards of clean granular fill material in grassy wetlands adjacent to the proposed Boniface Interchange, Project RF-042-1(66).

The area of wetlands affected is less than one-half acre of right-of-way located east of Turpin Street on the north side of the Glenn Highway, Alaska Route 1. There is no practical alternative to placement of fill in this wetland area since the proposed project is a reconstruction of the existing highway. Placement of fill should not alter local drainage characteristics, nor will it significantly alter the water table of adjacent wetlands. Measures to minimize impact to other isolated wet-

lands adjacent to the transportation corridor include providing adequate drainage structures and roadside ditches to facilitate normal drainage patterns.
