Senior guard Anna Pletnikoff, and Joyce Pete, a junior, also pumped in over 100 points with 128 and 110, respectively. Pete set a new consistency mark hitting 40.8 per cent of her field goal attempts.

Another junior, Bernadette Moses, was the second leading rebounder with 156, and fouryear letterman Linda Takumjenak picked off 73 stolen

balls and dished out 59 assists. The two other seniors on the team were noteworthy as Bertha Evan connected 11 of 15 free throws for an excellent 73 per cent mark and Christine Hunt moved into the number ten position on the all-time scoring list with 150 tallies during her career.

This year's team was the highest-scoring and sharpest shooting Bravette squad, with an average of 46.3 points per game and a 32.1 per cent shooting percentage.

The Bravettes finished with a 21-7 record and were the only Southeast team to defeat Ketchikan in the past two seasons. The other members of the team that competed in the Southeast Tournament were sophomores Anna George, Bernice Evan, Kathy Dushkin, and Agnes Aloysius.
