SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

The Notice of Proposed Changes in the Regulations of the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission issued on May 14, 1984, is supplemented by the following information:

1. In response to requests from the public, the Commission seeks public comment on the issue of whether to limit the Southeastern Alaska dungeness crab fishery.

2. Notice is given that any interested person may present oral or written statemets regarding this supplemental proposal or the original proposals outlined below, at a public hearing to be held on Monday, proposals June 18, 1984; at 7:30 p.m. in Room 108 Regency Motor Inn, 2200 Fifth Avenue (Fifth & Blanchard), Seattle, Washington. The original Notice of Proposed Changes in the Regulations of the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission issued May 14, 1984, regarding the possible limitation of the Southeastern Alaska king and Tanner crab fisheries is restated as follows:

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission under the authority of the Limited Entry Act, A.S. 16.43.-010 and following, proposes to adopt, amend, and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code (which action is not expected to require an increased appropriation).

In response to comments from interested members of the public and as the result of its analysis of available data, the Commission proposes taking the first step toward limiting entry in the following designated Southeastern Alaska crab fisheries. The Commission proposes to establish by regulation the maximum number of entry permits to be issued in each identified fishery. THIS IS ONLY A PROPOSAL, and the Commission is asking for public comment on this issue. The period for public comment will run at least through August 31, 1984. If the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission adopts regulations during calendar year 1984 that establish maximum numbers for the designated fisheries, the date for determining eligibility to apply for a permanent entry permit would be January 1, 1984. Only those applicants who had participated as gear license or interim-use permit holders in the designated fisheries prior to January 1, 1984, would be eligible to apply for permanent entry

This proposal does not include a proposed point system for ranking applicants. If and when the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission were to establish by regulation maximum numbers, the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission would thereafter propose for public comment a point system for ranking eligible applicants.

The outline of the proposal is as follows:

1. This proposal is intended to cover Southeastern Alaska only and doesnot include the Yakutat area or any other area of the State.

2. For purposes of limiting entry, the Commission proposes to establish the following separate fisheries: (a) the Southeastern Alaska red and

blue king crab pot fishery; (b) the Southeastern Alaska brown

king crab pot fishery; (c) the Southeastern Alaska Tanner crab pot fishery.

The Commission proposes establishing maximum numbers of entry permits for each of the designated crab fisheries as follows:

131 4. The Commission proposes that an individual who qualifies for a permit in more than one of the designated crab fisheries would receive only one combined, nonseverable permit entitling that individual to fish in each of the fisheries for which he would be qualified.

5. If the proposed maximum numbers are to be adopted, the Commisson anticipates that all permits issued thereafter would be trans-
