Moves to Stop Bogus Indian Arts

The Attorney General of Arirona has issued an injunction ordering trading posts in that state to halt the sale of "Indian" beadwork, rugs, jewelry, dolls and baskets which reportedly are manufactured in Japan and

mexico.

The injunction came after state investigators raided six shops along Route 66 in upstate Arizona and found as much as 95 percent of the goods to be imported.

The Attorney General's office The Attorney General s office says its investigators can prove that merchants have falsely pass-ed off the crafts as "authentic Indian wares" and that foreign manufacturing labels have been removed by shopkeepers, reremoved by shopkeepers, resulting in "tremendous losses" sulting in "tremendous lo to authentic Indian artisans
