

Rights Commission Meeting Here

ANCHORAGE — It was announced from Anchorage that the five-member Board of Commissioners to the Alaska Human Rights Commission will meet in Fairbanks on June 14 through 16.

The meeting will begin at 10:00 a.m. in the Conference Room of the Fairbanks Native Welcome Center on Wednesday and it will be open to the public.

The Board will hear reports from Executive Director Robert Willard which will include his recommendations on an order to finalize an age discrimination case against another state agency —which the Board has already ruled on, but the decision has never been made public.

Willard will also report on the latest Alaska Native, Black and other minority-hire statistics employed by the state government and the current status of the Alaska Plan.

Other topics include a model ordinance for presentation to city's and borough's for their consideration to establish Human Relations Commissions on a local level, along with other items of interest.

The Commission will allow individuals or groups to appear in person during the three day meeting.
