"Bidders must submit certification stating whether or not they intend to subcontract a portion of the work and, if so, that they have taken affirmative action to seek out and consider minority business enterprises as potential subcontractors. Each bidder intending to subcontract part of the contract work shall make contact with potential minority business enterprises subcontractors to affirmatively solicit their interest, capability, and price, and shall document the results of such contact. A bidder's failure to submit this certification or submission of a false certification shall render his bid unresponsive."

Certification Form 25A-230 will be included with the bidding documents.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Education, under authority vested by AS 14.07.060, proposes to amend its Regulations in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 14.02.070(c) and AS 14.02.010(1) and (2) as follows:

1. 4 AAC 05.070 is amended by making more specific the obligations of school districts to provide for community participation in the planning and evaluation of local school programs, and also making more specific the required elements of the planning and evaluation documents and process.
2. 4 AAC 12. is amended by requiring that all school district superintendents to possess an administrative certificate with an endorsement as superintendent.

OF RIGHT-OF-WAY GRANT
TO
NORTHERN TIER PIPELINE
COMPANY

The Secretary of the Interior, on April 21, 1980, issued a right-of-way grant to the Northern Tier Pipeline Company. The grant authorizes the company to use federal public lands along a 149.1-mile land route from Port Angeles, Washington to Clearbrook, Minnesota. This grant was a result of "fast track" action initiated by the President's January 17 declaration that a west-to-east crude oil transportation system was in the national interest, and his selection of Northern Tier as the project designated to receive expedited federal permitting. The federal grant commits the Government to a 50-foot plus the width of the pipe right-of-way on federal lands within a two mile planning corridor.

The grant is a unique means of expediting energy related projects. It enables the Northern Tier Company to survey, finalize project design, arrange financing, contract to move oil through the future pipeline, and secure the necessary state and other federal permits. It does not authorize construction.

Concurrent with the Northern Tier Company's actions, Federal Government agencies will be developing site specific stipulations to alleviate any damaging effects associated with construction. These stipulations will be responsive to federal management objectives and areas of special concern such as wildlife, historical and cultural resources, and identified environmental statement prepared by the Federal Government in 1979. The Government will also be conducting various state studies related to the construction and operation phases which will be used to develop site specific stipulations.

The stipulations will subsequently be reviewed with the Northern Tier Company in conjunction with their project design. Any stipulations that

adequately address the final project design will be included in a "Notice to Proceed." Such grant stipulations, if the Company cannot meet the President's conditions for the stipulations, the "Notice to Proceed" will not be issued.
