# Bigger

## Government isn't designed

—it grows. This applies on all levels, from local to Federal. And, in the case of the State of Alaska, the situation is getting out of hand.

"Functional Design" is a term that describes mechanisms and systems that use only the elements necessary for them to function properly. It's the way American industry tries to do everything from building a ten-speed bicycle to drilling an oil well. And it's a term with which State government seems to be totally unfamiliar.

In a state with a population of less than half a million, our government has expanded to the point where the regulatory tangle at the State level is now almost as complex as that of the Federal government. And excessive Federal regulation is something we don't need to explain to over-regulated Alaskans.

Private industry can't afford to expand indiscriminately. Industry

has a responsibility to its stockholders—and that responsibility gives private industry the incentive to streamline its existing structures, rather than build a bureaucracy.

Government, on the other hand, traditionally tries to increase its efficiency by increasing its size. The result? More agencies, commissions, fact-finding groups, regulatory boards. More paperwork. More personnel. More confusion. Less efficiency. And the money to support this overgrown bureaucracy is coming out of taxpayers' pockets.

It's time to call a halt to excessive growth in State government. Alaskans need to impose realistic limitations on just how much the State can spend. We of the Alaska Oil and Gas Association feel that the solution lies in the willingness of Alaskans to control their own government, before it gets too big to handle.
