Minimum Wage

The federal minimum wage was raised from \$3.10 to \$3.35 on January 1, 1981, for workers on the low end of the salary pay scale.

The state employees minimum wages was also increased from \$3.60 to \$3.85, an increase of 6.9 percent. The state statute, state jobs pays 50 cents an hour more than federal jobs.

The federal minimum wage increase affects some 5.6 million workers across the country and is the 4th year in a row in which the minimum wage was increased.

Minimum wage law violaters are subject under some circumstances to criminal penalties.
