If there are any substantial and particularized objections by bona fide residents of Ekuk to this entity representing the collective interest of the residents of Ekuk respecting municipal trust land, those objections must be filed with the Municipal Trust Lands Officer, Department of Community and Regional Affairs, 225 Cordova, Bldg. "B", Anchorage, Alaska 99501, within thirty (30) days after publication and posting of this notice. INVITATION FOR BIDS STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES DIVISION OF HIGHWAY DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project X-20179 Circle District Mining Roads, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, February 19, 1981 in the Division Director's Office, Division of Highway Design and Construction, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading and drainage of 19.94 miles of roadway.

Principal items of work consist of the following: all required construction engineering by the contractor; all required clearing; 68,000 cubic yards of borrow; 34,500 cubic yards of embankment; and 4,500 linear feet of 12 and 36 inch pipe conduit. All work shall be completed in 90 Calendar Days.

The following provisions are made a part of all advertisements for highway construction contracts:

"Bidders must submit certifications stating whether or not they intend to subcontract a portion of the work and, if so, that they have taken affirmative action to seek out and consider minority business enterprises as potential subcontractors. Each bidder intending to sublet part of the contract work shall make contact with potential minority business enterprises subcontractors to affirmatively solicit their interest, capability, and prices, and shall document the results of such contacts. A bidder's failure to submit this certification or submission of a false certification shall render his bid unresponsive."

Certification Form 25A320 will be included with the bidding documents.

Plans and specifications may be obtained by all who have a bona fide need for them for bidding purposes from the Chief of Engineering Services, P.O. Box 1467, Juneau, Alaska, 99802, at a charge of \$10.00 (non-refundable) for each assembly.
