INVITATION FOR BIDS LIMITED TO QUALIFIED INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS AND INDIAN-OWNED ECONOMIC ENTERPRISES

1. Pursuant to 24 D.F.R. 805.204, the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority has sought letters of intent from Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises regarding an interest in bidding the projects listed below. Because letters of intent were received, North Pacific Rim Housing Authority is conducting a bid limited to Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises. See 24 C.F.R. 805.204(a)(1)(ii), Stage 2. The North Pacific Rim Housing Authority will receive from Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises only sealed bids, in duplicate, for the construction of the projects listed hereafter until 3:00 p.m. local time, on the 2nd day of July 1981, at the office of the Owner, 903 W. Northern Lights, Suite 203, Anchorage, Alaska 99503, at which time and place all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. If North Pacific Rim Housing Authority fails to receive an approvable bid or proposal from one or more qualified Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises, the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority will readvertise for bids or proposals without limiting the bidding to Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises.

2. Description of Projects.

a. HUD Project AK02-8015-003, twenty (20) units of wood frame detached, single family houses in Port Graham, Alaska, consisting of nine (9) two-bedroom units at \$10 sq. ft. each, three (3) three-bedroom units at \$72 sq. ft. each, and eight (8) four-bedroom units at \$108 sq. ft. each.

b. HUD Project AK02-8015-004, thirty-one (31) units of wood frame detached, single family houses in Port Graham, Alaska, consisting of fifteen (15) two-bedroom units at \$10 sq. ft. each, nine (9) three-bedroom units at \$72 sq. ft. each, and ten (10) four-bedroom units at \$108 sq. ft. each. The work also includes construction of streets as described on Bidding and Contract documents.

c. HUD Project AK02-8015-005, eighteen (18) units of wood frame detached, single family houses in Tatitlek, Alaska, consisting of two (2) two-bedroom units at \$10 sq. ft. each, and six (6) three-bedroom units at \$72 sq. ft. each, and ten (10) four-bedroom units at \$108 sq. ft. each. The work also includes construction of streets as described on Bidding and Contract documents.

d. Alternate No. 1 consisting of the construction of onsite utilities (sewer and water) at Tatitlek.

3. Alternate Construction Systems.

The project has been developed based on "stick construction" system. However, the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority will accept alternative construction systems if they comply with the design criteria outlined in the Contract Documents.

4. Contractors may bid a single project (village), any combination of two projects separately, or all three projects as a package. North Pacific Rim Housing Authority reserves the right to accept the bid or combination of bids which will permit North Pacific Rim Housing Authority to construct average price per unit for one or more of the projects for the lowest total cost, even if the average price per unit for one or more of the projects exceeds the average price

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76-1 unit in a bid for a single project or for two of the three projects.

7. A certified check or bank draft, payable to the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority, U.S. Government bonds, or a satisfactory bid bond executed by the bidder and acceptable to the Bidding Agent, in an amount equal to five percent of the bid shall be submitted with each bid.

Bidders are advised that the work covered by the Contract will be subject to provisions for Indian Preference and Local Hire as well as the minimum prevailing wage rates established by the U.S. Department of Labor (Davis-Bacon) and the Equal Opportunity Requirements of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

9. The successful Bidder will be required to furnish a Performance Bond and Labor and Material Payment Bond in the amount of 100% of the Contract Price.

10. Prospective bidders seeking to qualify as an Indian Organization or Indian-Owned Enterprise shall submit with or prior to submission of the bid:

a) Evidence showing fully the extent of Indian ownership and interest.
b) Evidence of structure, management and financing affecting the Indian character of the enterprise including major subcontracts and purchase agreements, material or equipment supply arrangements and evidence showing the effect of these on the extent of Indian Ownership and interest.

c) Evidence sufficient to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority and HUD that the prospective Bidder has the technical, administrative and financial capability to perform contract work of the size, scope and type and within the time stipulated for these projects.

11. The North Pacific Rim Housing Authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids to waive any informalities in the bidding.
12. No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of thirty (30) days subsequent to the opening of bids without the consent of the North Pacific Rim Housing Authority.
