

# New Iditarod Trail Committee named

Seven new board members were elected to the Iditarod Trail Committee when the committee held a general membership meeting in Anchorage recently.

The Board meets at least four times a year in different locations around the state and is charged with the responsibility of setting policy for the 1049 mile dog sled race from Anchorage to Nome. The 1982 race will be the 10th running of the event.
