

NW Film Festival to Air At APU

Award winning experimental films will be shown at 8:00pm February 14 in Alaska Pacific University's Grant Hall Auditorium in Anchorage. The Saturday night showing of the Eighth Annual Northwest Film and Video Festival will include "The Hometown", "Cuts", "Palm Sunday", "Lotomania", "Dinosaur", "Haleakala", "House of the Sun", and "Some of these Days". The film treatment will range from serious to humorous and abstract to documentary. The public is invited to attend the showing of these contemporary experiment-

al films. Admission is \$3.00 and will be collected at the door.

Each year the Northwest Film Study Center in Portland, Oregon sponsors the festival to survey new moving image art. The work is submitted by residents of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Alaska and British Columbia.

The judge this year was Amos Vogel, who for over 35 years has been bringing recognition to avant garde cinema. His book "Film as a Subversive Art" is a major work on independent cinema. And currently, he is director of Film at the Anneberg

School of Communications at the University of Pennsylvania.

Alaskan filmmakers who are interested in entering next years competition should attend the festival to see what is being done in the field. Others are invited for pure entertainment.
