During the five week course at the Academy, the Officers will receive two weeks' training in emergency medical treatment, one week's training in substantive and procedural law, one week's training in the Alaskan Justice System, domestic violence, boating safety, search & rescue procedures, and local government. The concluding week will include practical exercises in investigation, report writing, and court procedures.

These village Officers will later receive two weeks of training in rural firefighting and fire prevention at the regional fire training center in Anchorage. They will receive further training in emergency medical treatment at regional locations thruout the state, four times yearly.

The Officers will receive continuing supervision from senior Officers in the regions where they will be serving. The village officers attend-
