

Water Program Starts Flowing

A program designed to solve the severe problems to safe drinking water and adequate waste disposal in Arctic villages will begin in February, Senator Stevens announced.

Senator Stevens, who co-sponsored the \$1 million project, said, "This is a great step for achieving a higher standard of living in our native villages. These services — which many of us view as essential — have been unavailable in the arctic. This is just the beginning of bringing modern comforts — indeed, necessities — to all Alaskans."

The program called the Village Demonstration Project will be administered by the Environmental Protection Agency's National Environmental Research Center. Initially, two villages, Emmonak and Wainwright, will be involved in the test program.

Modular demonstration units set up in the two villages will consist of more than a dozen rooms plus water storage area. In the facility will be men's and women's washrooms, showers and saunas, toilets, washing machines and dryers, and a small laboratory.

Also, the units will house equipment to:

- purify lakes or river water to provide the communities with drinking water;
- treat and clean water used in showers and laundry equipment so it can be re-cycled into laundry and toilet systems;
- incinerate all sewage and solid wastes collected from village homes by special tracked vehicles;
- recover water heat from the incinerators and circulate it to help heat the buildings.

The day to day maintenance and operation of the services at Wainwright and Emmonak will be provided by two natives from each village who have been trained at the Arctic Environmental Research Laboratory in Barrow.

The Village Demonstration Project is the end result of much cooperation between native leaders, state and local officials, and federal agencies. And if it proves feasible in Emmonak and Wainwright, as planners are confident it will, the system can be put into use all over the arctic.
