Between his legislative feats, Gruening wrote numerous articles and several books among them, "Mexico and its Heritage," "The State of Alaska," "An Alaska Reader, and in 1967 "The Battle for Alaska Statehood." His autobiography, "Many Battles," was published late last year.

He was indeed, Alaska's grand old man, but how to describe him? "It would be very hard to put into words," said McCutcheon two years ago, as Gruening was rushed to a hospital from the national Democratic Convention and underwent emergency surgery for an intestinal blockage, while the convention prayed for his health.

"He's the greatest thing that ever happened to Alaska politically and medically speaking—an absolutely fantastic person and a great influence on my life.

"There was no question but that he zeroed in the attention of the American public on the plight of the people here, Alaska was so terribly exploited before he got here," McCutcheon said.

"U.S. senator, editor, author," begins the brief biographical description of Gruening in "Who's Who in America," but Gruening was much more than that. The gentle, white-haired old statesman was a legend in his own times; one of the most beloved men of this last frontier of Alaska.
