Miss Sheila Turner, associate editor of the SCOPE MAGAZINE, one of magazines published by the Scholastic Magazines, Inc. of New York, is joining the staff of the Tundra Times as a reporter in the latter part of May. Miss Turner has obtained the permission of Richard Robinson, editor of SCOPE, to work for Tundra Times for at least three months during spring and summer.

Sheila's journalistic background includes working for the Chicago Sun-Times as assistant to the food editor, the Post-Tribune of Gary, Indiana, and a weekly news-

paper at the Jewish community in Chicago. She joined the staff of Scholastic Magazines in February of 1966.

"I decided to be a reporter when I was about eleven," Miss Turner said. "I heard it was easier for girls to get newspaper jobs if they had degrees in home economics and could work on women's pages."

Sheila prepared for a journalistic career by getting her degree in home economics from Cornell University in 1959.

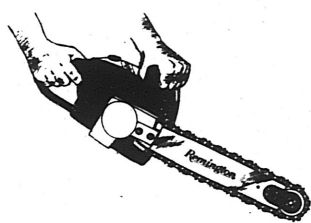
